## What is an internship?

An internship is a learning experience that offers practical work related to a student's field of study or career interest.

Most internships should be paid. If you are looking at an unpaid internship, join us for a drop-in to learn more. Internships can also be for credit or not for credit (check with your academic advisor).

## What are the benefits of having an internship?

CSU students who complete one internship are **more likely to secure employment upon graduation**, have higher starting salaries, and more often land jobs in fields relevant to their majors.

An internship experience can help you determine if you are truly interested in that work or can help you eliminate a career path. Either way, that's progress. In addition, completing an internship allows you to build relationships with current employees who may become mentors or colleagues when you are ready for a full-time career.

### How can I organize my search?

It can be helpful to organize your search to ensure you do not miss deadlines and to help you determine how much energy you will need to spend on the different internship applications. Consider using a table, like the one below, to help you stay organized.


